

Ordinance #2017-03-02(B)

An ordinance amending ordinance #122 section 3 to read as follows: any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of an infraction. The fine for such violation shall be \$50 for the first offense and \$75 for each subsequent offense.

And, section 1 (a) to read: For any person under the age of sixteen years to be or remain in or upon any of the streets, alleys, public places, or vacant lots within the Town, between the hours of 11:00 P.M. on any day of the week and 4:00 A.M. of the day following such times, and

This ordinance shall be effective upon proper posting as required by law.

Adopted and passed by the Mantua Town Council as required by law this 2nd day of March 2017.

ORDINANCE NO 122

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A CURFEW FOR JUVENILES WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF MANTUA TOWN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF MANTUA TOWN as follows:

Section 1: It shall be unlawful:

(a) For any person under the age of sixteen years to be or remain in or upon any of the streets, alleys, public places, or vacant lots within the Town, between the hours of 10:00 P.M. on any Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday night and 4:00 A.M. of the day following such times, or from the hours of 11:00 P.M. on Fridays and Saturdays until 4:00 A.M. following, and

(b) For any person of the age of sixteen years or seventeen years to be or remain in or upon any of the streets, alleys, public places or vacant lots within the Town, between the hours of 11:00 P.M., Sundays, Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays and 4:00 A.M. following, or between the hours of 12:00 Midnight on Saturdays and Sundays and 4:00 A.M. following, unless such person is accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person having legal custody of such minor person or unless such minors employment or lawful business makes it necessary to be upon the streets, alleys, or public places between such specified hours, in which event such minor person shall obtain a permit from the Town Marshall of the Town to be upon the streets, alleys or public places during such periods. The permit referred to herein shall be kept upon the person and it shall be unlawful for a minor having been issued such a permit to be upon the streets, alleys, or public places or vacant lots within the curfew hours without such permit upon such person.

Section 2: It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian or other person having legal charge or custody of any person under eighteen years of age to allow or permit any such child, ward or other person under such age, while in such legal custody, to go or be in or upon any of the streets, alleys, or public places in the Town when such going or being in or upon such streets, alleys or public places would be in violation by such minor person of any provision of this section.

Section 3: Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. *IN ACTION \$50*

Section 4: All ordinances or provisions of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5: In the opinion of the President and Town Board of the Town of Mantua, it is necessary, for the peace, health, and safety of the inhabitants of the Town of Mantua, that this ordinance become effective immediately upon posting. This Ordinance shall be deposited in the office of the Clerk of the Town of Mantua and posted in three public places within said Town, and shall take effect immediately upon its first such posting.
